- Homework help

Who We Serve

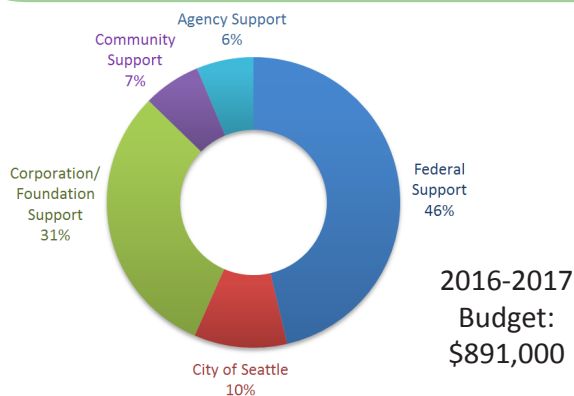
YTP serves over 450 first through twelfth grade students each year. The vast majority of these students come from low income families.

78% come from families at or below 30% of the area median income

87% come from families where English is not the home language
